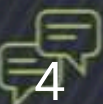

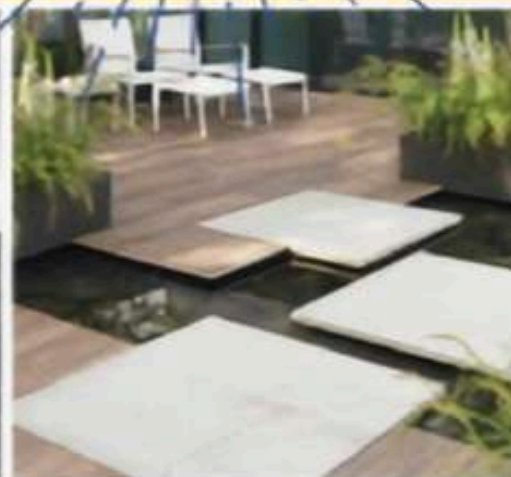
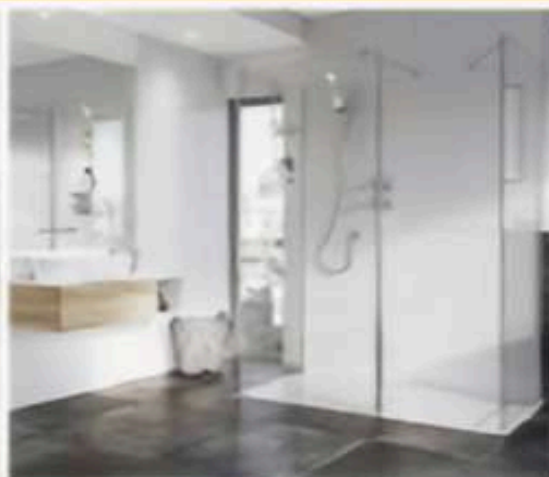

Club Chairman's Notes

Happy New Year to you ALL.

Just a brief update on progress since my last report on our facilities development at Birch Park,

The 'eagle eyed' will have noticed that we have installed solar panels on the Clubhouse and will shortly be progressing the installations on the Sports Hall and the Changing Room Building, this scheme has been funded from the UKSPF Sustainability Grant and the Sustainable Development Fund (SSE).

Following timely reminders of the need for additional Car Parking spaces at Birch Park, it was confirmed that Planning permission will be required and work continues in working up a scheme for an extension of the existing Car Park complete with drainage, plus the introduction of a one-way system around the Sports Hall. In addition, the NLC have pledged their support in acquiring land located off Newdown Road to create a Parking area and the provision of pedestrian access to the grass playing pitches..

Following a successful meeting with the North Lincolnshire Council they have pledged their support to fund the necessary improvements and developments for the Bottesford Sports Hall which has seen no significant improvements to the facility since it was opened in 1980.

Within our Development Plan, proposals have been received and are under consideration for the creation of a 'soft play' area for the families with younger children developing the existing outside Beer Garden and the waste land behind the Clubhouse.

The installation of additional fencing and gates to improve the site security is almost complete but it is a 'losing battle' with the local youth damaging fencing to get access to our grass pitches. Finally, as the weather improves so will the refurbishment of the Portakabin donated by LKAB into a hospitality facility, media room, & Club Shop.

Watch this space for more updates.

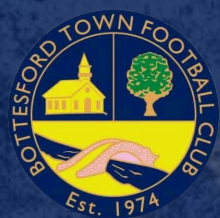

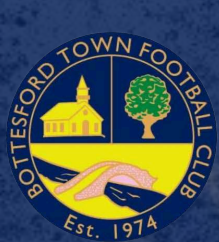

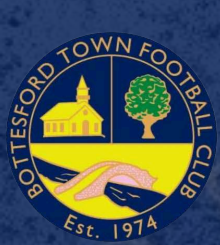

Club History

The Club was formed in 1974 and played their football in the Lincolnshire League. The original base was at the Dolphin pub, with the football being played at Fred Gough School. The Club moved to its current Birch Park home in 1983.

The senior side experienced a successful period during the early 90's winning a number of Cup competitions and the Lincolnshire League in

three successive seasons, In 2000 the 1st team entered the Central Midlands League gaining promotion in 2005 to Division 1 in the Northern Counties East Football League. In 2016 they won the 'play-off' final to gain promotion to the Premier League where they have played for the last 5 seasons. The Club has for many years supported the local Scunthorpe and District adult Football Leagues, The year 2000 saw the amalgamation of the Junior and Senior Clubs clearly demonstrating that players starting with the Club at the age of 6 could be encouraged to stay with the Club for their progress in football.

The Club today has 25 teams both boys and girls playing mini-soccer in the local Saturday Kalson League, 11 a-side teams in the Sunday Kalson League, Youth football being played in the Junior Premier League, & the Lincolnshire Intermediate League, and a Development Squad playing in the Central Midlands Football League. A newly formed Veterans team who will play in the Humber Veterans League In 2018 a new addition to the Club was the introduction of the DSActive team for individuals who are Downs Syndrome, the team has grown from strength to strength and they now perform in the Ability Counts League.

Exciting times lay ahead with our next development focusing on a number of improvements for the Bottesford Sports Hall

The Club's proudest achievement was in 2003 when they became a FA Charter Standard Community Club, being one of the first Clubs in the Country at that time to get the achievement. The Club had to work very hard to meet all of the FA criteria and is now reaping the benefits and rewards. In 2009, the Club achieved the distinction of being awarded by the Lincolnshire Football Association as the FA Charter Standard Club of the year, a reward for the efforts of the members of the Club. This massive involvement in 'grass roots football' and its development has seen the provision of enhanced facilities to support the same, with the introduction of a magnificent Changing Room & Meeting Room facility in 2009 for the use of all those who play their sport at Birch Park. Developments continued in 2019 with the aid of grant support from both the North Lincolnshire and Bottesford Town Councils together with the Football Foundation, with the addition of a new tractor and grass cutting maintenance equipment plus the replacement of the floodlights for the main pitch with a modern LED installation which was designed for the future provision of a new Stadia Facility incorporating a 3G playing surface.

2020 also saw through the efforts of number of volunteers & sponsors, a new Catering Facility to serve the needs of everybody who visits Birch Park.

Proudly, the Club today is able to announce that after many years of preparation and with the financial support from predominantly the Football Foundation, the North Lincolnshire Council and the S.S.E. Sustainable Community Fund, together with other supporting groups, the new £1.5m Barrett Steel Stadium facility was officially opened in July 2023.

Eccleshill United History

The club was established before World War Two but was disbanded due to the war. After reforming in 1948, Eccleshill United were members of the Bradford Amateur League - in the 1950s.

The club won the Bradford Amateur League cup in 1962 and later moved up to the West Riding County Amateur League. Then reaching the Premier Division in 1972 and winning the league in 1977. 1982, the club applied to join the Northern Counties East League but were rejected.

The 1984/85 season saw the club win the Bradford & District Senior Cup, and at the end of the Season, Eccleshill was accepted into division three of Northern Counties East League. The club made ground improvements to play in the league and in the following season, Eccleshill retained the Bradford & District Senior Cup. At the end of the 1985/86 season division three was abolished, and Eccleshill moved up to division two. They finished runners up in 1987, therefore being promoted to division one.

Eccleshill United bounced in and out of the premier division and division one from the late 80s through to the late 2000s.

In 2014, the eagles won the west riding county cup, defeating Harrogate town in the final. The club's last promotion into the NCEL premier division, where they remain, was in 2018, when the eagles beat Grimsby Borough 3-2 in the playoff final. The 2021/2022 season was Eccleshill's best finish in the league coming 2nd and having a play off game against step 5 Kempton Rovers to try and win promotions to step 5. The game finished 2-2 after extra time and we lost 6-4 on penalties.



NCEL Round Up

The stop-start beginning to 2025 continued in midweek with six postponements and one abandonment due to the bad weather, leaving just four matches played to a conclusion as many NCEL clubs continued to endure an unplanned winter break. Ilkley Town were involved in West Riding County Cup action as the Division One side travelled to Pitching In Northern Premier League hosts Pontefract Collieries in their Quarter-Final tie. The Baht'atters battled hard against their opponents who are two steps above them in the FA's National League System but they conceded a couple of goals at the start of the second period in a 2-0 defeat.

There were three games in Division One with Worsbrough Bridge Athletic and Maltby Main keeping themselves in eighth and ninth spot, respectively, with victories. Worsbrough picked up a fine 3-2 win at third-placed Brigg Town as the home side's six-match winning run in the league came to an end. The hosts came from behind twice with Ben Vazquez and Daniel North equalising after Owen Birks and then Jack Appleyard had given the Briggers the lead. Connor Glavin netted to put Worsbrough ahead for a third time in the 87th minute and that proved decisive.

Maltby took the lead in the third minute through Ashley Flynn only to be pegged back by Bailey Wright on the quarter-of-an-hour mark for visitors Louth Town. But, the Miners grabbed the winner in a 2-1 victory early in the second period through Wade Ripley. Armthorpe Welfare have moved to six points clear of the relegation zone as they won 1-0 at home to next-to-bottom Yorkshire Amateur. Marc Newsham scored what proved to be the vital strike in the 79th minute as his side climb to fifteenth in the table.

Meanwhile, in the Premier Division, Eccleshill United's home clash with Champion was abandoned at half-time due to fog with the game goalless.

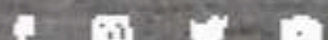
